

MY LIFE IN CARE SURVEY 2022 RESULTS





MINISTER'S MESSAGE

Every child deserves to grow up in a safe and stable home environment, free from violence and harm, surrounded by family, community, and culture. Unfortunately, this is not the case for some Queensland children who require the care and support of the state to ensure their safety and wellbeing.

Children in care have often experienced significant trauma and instability in their lives and need additional help and support to overcome these challenges and thrive.

The experiences of children in care can be vastly different, but ultimately, we must do all we can to ensure they feel supported, loved, and cared for. It is vital that we hear directly from children and young people about their experiences so we can identify ways in which we can improve, while also building on our successes.

I am pleased to share the results of the Queensland Government's My Life in Care Survey 2022, giving us a greater understanding of, and insight into the lives of children and young people in the child protection system in Queensland.

To see that so many children feel supported and cared for during what can often be an extremely difficult time is heartening, and a testament to their resilience and strength. It is also testament to the dedication and commitment of the carers, caseworkers and support staff who work tirelessly to provide the best possible care.

It's clear that we must continue our efforts to improve outcomes for children in care, particularly in the areas of education, physical and mental health, and transitioning to adulthood. We remain committed to supporting children throughout their care journey, from the moment they enter care to the time they leave.

I would like to sincerely thank the children and young people who took part in this survey, as well as the carers and caseworkers who supported them in this process.

This survey is about amplifying the voices of children in care and showing them that we are listening, that their experiences matter, and their insights will help create a better child safety sector for all.

As the Minister for Child Safety, the safety and wellbeing of all children, and especially children in care, is paramount to me. I am so proud of the progress we have made in supporting families and protecting vulnerable children, but there is always more to be done.

Let us continue to work together to create communities where every child feels safe, loved, and supported, surrounded by family, community, and culture.

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ABOUT THIS SURVEY

All children and young people in care have a right to be heard and listened to.

In 2022, we conducted the My life in Care survey of Queensland children and young people in care aged 10-18 in the guardianship of the Chief Executive or on long term orders where their guardian consented. This was to find out how they feel about their lives, the care and support they receive, and what could be changed to make things better for them.

We asked their views on their experience of the care system, including their placement and different aspects of their lives, including their family and relationships. This report summarises their responses.

The responses provide an insight into what is working well for children and young people in care, and what needs to change so we can improve life in care for all Queensland children and young people.



The Children's Health Human Research and Ethics Committee (ECoo175) reviewed and approved this survey.



PLACEMENT






ESTIMATED TOTAL








HOW CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE 12 YEARS AND OVER RATE THEIR MENTAL HEALTH







CAN CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE ACCESS ITEMS WHEN THEY NEED THEM?












WHAT WOULD HELP CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE WITH THEIR SCHOOLING




PROPORTION OF CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE WHO HAVE BEEN BULLIED IN THE LAST MONTH









TRANSITIONING TO ADULTHOOD




HOW CONFIDENT THEY ARE ABOUT CARING FOR THEMSELVES IN EACH OF THE FOLLOWING:





PROPORTION WHO FEEL INCLUDED IN DECISIONS ABOUT THEIR LIVES














CAN CONTACT THEIR CHILD SAFETY OFFICER WHEN THEY NEED TO




FEEL THE SAME AS THEIR PEERS WHO ARE NOT IN CARE








THEIR TIME IN CARE










OF CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE SAID THEY WERE ABORIGINAL AND/OR TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER

HOW MUCH THEY CAN FOLLOW THEIR CULTURE WHERE THEY LIVE




LEARNED QUITE A BIT TO A LOT ABOUT THEIR CULTURE FROM*


